LIMPOPO MEMBERS OF THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL (MECs) SIGN SERVICE DELIVERY AGREEMENTS WITH THE PREMIER

COVID 19 has left a devastating trail of economic destruction throughout the globe. President Cyril Ramaphosa recently tabled the South African Economic Reconstruction and Recovery Plan to fight the adverse effects of the COVID 19 pandemic. Limpopo province, as part of the global village was not spared, hence the development of the provincial version of same which is at an advanced stage.

In a concerted effort to accomplish the developmental aspirations of the people of Limpopo, Premier Chupu Stanley Mathabatha signed Service Delivery Agreements with all his MECs today.
