Premier Mathabatha meets the community of Alldays Town

Premier Chupu Stanley Mathabatha is hard at work making sure that the Provincial Government provides services and monitor milestones achieved to improve the lives of previously disadvantaged people of Alldays Town in Blouberg Municipality through the EXCO Imbizo Programme.

Through a research conducted by the Provincial Government, the following challenges were identified and given priority by the relevant sector departments: dilapidated structure of the Police Station and the Police Officer's residence; In conducting their daily responsibilities, the Police officers encounter challenges of crime and stock theft. The community indicated shortages of classrooms, furniture and learning materials in schools. Some community members travel 90 km to Ratshatsha Health Centre which is a risk to pregnant women and those with fatal deceases. The other challenge faced by community is of a Farmer who displayed Black Coffins along the fence of his farm.

The Premier and his Executive Council will deliberate on these challenges and find permanent solutions that will curb poor service delivery and bring radical economic transformation to the people of Alldays Town and surrounding villages. It is however not all doom and gloom: The community of Alldays Town raised money to fund the children who matriculated the previous year, making sure they pay for tuition fees. A Community Police Forum (CPF) is up and running; The town is electrified, making it easier and safer for the community members to walk

at night.
