3. What options are available for those who have failed and what are the processes for those options?

Failed candidates:

- (a) Qualifying candidates may apply for supplementary examination as each candidate is advised on the statement of results – closing date is <u>19</u> <u>January 2017.</u>
- (b) May apply for remarking (R92.00), rechecking (R21.00) or viewing (R180.00) closing date is19 January 2017
- (c) May register as a part-time candidate to sit for examination in November/December – closing date is **15 March 2017** – The Circuit Office will allocate relevant part-time examination centre to each candidate.
