OPENING ADDRESS TO THE LIMPOPO EXCO LEKGOTLA BY THE PREMIER OF LIMPOPO HONOURABLE CHUPU MATHABATHA HELD AT THE FOREVER RESORTS WARMBATHS, BELA-BELA.

Program director;

Members of the Executive Council; Our newly appointed Director General, Ntate Nape Nchabeleng; Heads of State-Owned Enterprises; Heads of our Provincial Departments; Representatives from the Office of the Auditor-General; Ladies and Gentlemen:

Good morning!

Thank you programme facilitator and MEC for LEDET ntate Seaparo Sekoati - let me join you in welcoming attendees to this very important 2017 edition of Exco Lekgotla.

This Lekgotla is taking place just days after the delivery of the State of the Nation Address by President Jacob Zuma.

It also takes place after the ANC Limpopo held its Lekgotla a few days ago to make serious economic transformational recommendations. The State of the Nation Address delivered under the theme Radical Transformation of the Economy. In this regard, the President focused on the delivery of the 12 urgent tasks put forward by the ANC during its Lekgotla in January.

We have signed a contract with these masses – they have delivered their continued support for this government, it is now time for us to deliver on their legitimate expectations.

It is for this reason that we will be giving this Lekgotla all the attention, focus and respect it deserves.

Every single presentation which will be made here today and tomorrow will be carrying a particular significance. No presentation will be made for the purpose of merely making a presentation of just prolonging the program.

The presentation on industrialisation projects with the focus on SEZs will assist us with the necessary understanding of what needs to be done in order to facilitate economic growth and development.

The same goes to the presentation on mining – we need to redefine the role of mining houses in our communities in

particular the role that the mining industry should play on the economic upliftment of our communities.

The presentations on Audit Outcomes and the implementation of Clean Audit Strategy are of high significance. As you know, good audit outcomes help to enhance public confidence in the government.

We can also expect that the recommendations from the AG presentation will help us identify and arrest areas of wastage. Curbing wastage will help us to direct resources to important areas such as education, health and projects that stimulate economic growth.

All other presentations carry the same weight and significance.
