And I would like to heap praises on our young girl, Xihlovo Leticia Makhavele who at a young age of 15 became Miss Teen Tourism 2019. This young lad from Bungeni was awarded the title in Manila, Phillipines. Limpopo is making history, producing Presidents, International Athletes and now an International model at a tender age.

You would recall that this occasion is interspersed with Africa Day celebration under the "Healthy Lifestyle Prolongs Life".linking snugly with Agenda 2063."

Free to be me" which is SATMA'S theme this year emaphises the centrality of yourselves as human beings expressing your being without any hindrance. Be yourselves because it's a constitutionally guaranteed inalienable right. You just cannot be anybody else or emulate his or her ways without loosing yourself.

She is completely lost and that is where SATMA comes in. To school her that literate form of expressions knows no colour. Arrogant people like her needs to be socialized into understanding that there is no culture that is superior, period!

Events of this nature have both direct and indirect economic spin-offs contributing to the rich and diverse heritage that we have as a Province. So it's a welcome initiative.
