What you simply have to understand is that you are not a generation of 1976. You are a unique generation, most of you born after our freedom and democracy. We expect you to become the touch bearers in a campaign to mobilise young people against crime and drugs.

You carry the obligation to spread the message of positive health style amongst the youth.

You must be a generation that makes education fashionable.

You must seize the opportunities that came with our freedom and democracy to equip yourselves with skills which you will use to advance the development of our country.

Without education you will not be able to seize the many opportunities that are availed to you.
