SANTACO AND SOUTH AFRICAN COUNCIL OF CHURCHES JOIN HANDS WITH GOVERNMENT IN THE FIGHT AGAINST GBV AND TAXI VIOLENCE

Limpopo Premier, Mr Chupu Stanley Mathabatha will lead the Provincial government delegation in a prayer session organized by the South African Council of Churches and SANTACO aimed at ending taxi violence, gender-based violence and road carnage amongst others.
