NEWLY SWORN MEC RADZILANI VOWS TO INVOLVE STAKEHOLDERS TO COMBAT CRIME AND CREATE RELIABLE TRANSPORT SYSTEM

MEC Radzilani was sworn in today at Limpopo High Court by Judge President Ephraim Makgoba.

Further said MEC Radzilani: "I join the Department during October Transport Month. This is also an opportunity to remind all our people of the importance of road safety. Let us all obey the rules of the road, to always arrive alive".

MEC Radzilani's swearing in follows Premier Chupu Stanley Mathabatha's reconfiguration of the Limpopo EXCO on 06 October 2022. The Premier said the reconfiguration comes out of a need to improve service provision to the people of Limpopo.
