## MEC KEKANA CONGRATULATES RENOWNED SCULPTOR, NORIA MABASA FOR BEING AWARDED AN HONORARY DOCTORATE

Vho-Mabasa's unique pottery and exquisite wood sculptures inspires confidence that those learning from her would continue in her footsteps.

At her advanced age, she continues to teach younger generations at her home academy. She has received several awards including a lifetime award from the National Heritage council at Meropa last year. We remain proud of this gentle giant.
