The event took place in Seokodibeng, Fetakgomo-Tubatse Municipality in Sekhukhune District.

Mini Miss Planet 2023, Ndaloenhle Sibanyoni, delivered an empowering message to her fellow black children, saying, "Black child, your dreams are valid. Even if it feels impossible, stay true to yourself, push hard enough. Someone will notice your effort. My motto has always been the same: 'books before boys because boys bring babies'."

Mr Thea Mohuba addressed important issues such as mental health, teenage pregnancy, and substance abuse. He expressed concern about the continuing problems that are perpetuated by adults on children. Mohuba highlighted the high number of pregnancies among children between the ages of 10 and 12, emphasising the need for self-control in men and proper supervision from parents or guardians. He also stressed the importance of children making good decisions about their lives.

Ms. Nandi Ndalane, Member of the Executive Council (MEC) responsible for Social Development, spoke on behalf of Premier Chupu Stanley Mathabatha. She said: "I would like all of us to acknowledge that every child has the right to a safe and nurturing environment, one that allows them to grow and develop to their fullest potential."
